

COMMISSIONER OF AGRICULTURE  
EMERGENCY ORDER  
2020-026

WHEREAS, on March 9, 2020, through Executive Order 20-52, the Governor of the State of Florida declared that Novel Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) poses a risk to the entire State of Florida, and that because of this danger, a state of emergency exists in the State of Florida; and

WHEREAS, on May 8, 2020, through Executive Order 20-114, and on July 7, 2020, through Executive Order 20-166, the Governor extended Executive Order 20-52; and

WHEREAS, the United States Centers for Disease Control and the Florida Department of Health recommends social distancing measures to control the spread of the COVID-19 outbreak; and

WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of Florida, pursuant to Executive Order 20-52, Section 4, Subparagraph B, authorized State agencies to suspend the effect of any regulatory statute, rule, or order that would in any way prevent, hinder, or delay necessary action in coping with the emergency; and

WHEREAS, Section 493.6105(5), Florida Statutes, and Rule 5N-1.132(1)(a), Florida Administrative Code, requires an applicant for a Class "G" license to submit proof of 28 hours of in person range and classroom training taught and administered by a Class "K" licensee; and

WHEREAS, Section 493.6108(2), Florida Statutes, requires an applicant for a Class "G" license to provide a certification by a physician or physician assistant of physical fitness; and

WHEREAS, the impact of COVID-19 may have prevented an applicant for a Class "G" license from obtaining classroom training or obtaining a certification by a physician or physician assistant of physical fitness due to the shortage of available medical care.


NOW THEREFORE, with the powers and authorities conferred by Article IV, Section 4, Florida Constitution, and Executive Order 20-52, as extended by Executive Orders 20-114 and 20-166, I hereby declare the following:

1. Emergency Order 2020-010 is hereby extended for sixty (60) days following the execution of this order.
2. Unless specifically suspended in this Order or any other Emergency Order issued pursuant to the authority conferred by Article IV, Section 4, Florida Constitution, and Executive Order 20-52, as extended by Executive Orders 20-114 and 20-166, all other portions of Chapter 493, Florida Statutes, and any rules promulgated thereunder remain in effect following the execution of this order.
